## 9:20 Where to Go from Here?

We will provide an overview of CADRE's schema and landscape with an illustration of the interconnections among key elements, concluding with major questions that will frame the discussions that follow. Underlying each presentation will be a discussion of strategies for engaging particular stakeholders with ongoing efforts and products. We will look for advisors' wisdom on challenges unique to particular elements.

9:45 Portfolio Analysis and Targeted Studies/Syntheses of Work within the Portfolio Alina Martinez and Daphne Minner (Abt Associates) will summarize the DR K–12 portfolio and describe the targeted studies being conducted this year. They will introduce the teacher and student instrumentation compendia and seek recommendations for further analysis of instruments and avenues for sharing the materials.

## 10:45 Capacity Building for DR K-12 Community

CADRE team members will describe the capacity-building initiative with a map of various elements and a depiction of their interrelationships. Challenge questions will relate to each capacity-building element, with discussions focusing on (1) PI meeting, thematic meetings (e.g., formative assessment, STEM Smart college and career readiness) and webinars; (2) building, sustaining, and strengthening the Fellows program and other early career outreach efforts; and (3) special interest and work groups (e.g., digital science curriculum). Greta Shultz (Donahue Institute) will highlight findings and perceived benefits of the suite of working groups, and share plans for continuing to measure their progress. Brenda Turnbull (PSA) will discuss ideas for a study that could lead to the identification of ways to make existing CADRE and CADRE-like work groups more effective.
